Government Plans

You will no doubt have seen and heard this week of the government's conditional plans to begin easing lockdown restrictions. Specifically, schools have been asked to begin *planning* for a possible return for pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 from June 1st at the earliest with other year groups following at a later date. As a school, we are carefully considering what this might mean for our community and are taking advice and guidance from the Department of Education, our Local Authority, and the Diocesan Board of Education. It would be premature of me to speculate now on exactly what this will mean for our children but it is clear that there will be significant changes to 'normal operation' for our classes. More information will be forthcoming as soon as we are able and I am grateful for your patience whilst we carefully plan the way ahead. Please be assured that the health and well-being of our children, staff and wider community are paramount in our considerations.

Home learning

We have been blown away by the many fantastic examples of home learning that continue to be sent in, we love to see them! Thank you for taking advantage of the many opportunities for home learning. Our teachers will continue connecting with you each week to provide work and support and a daily timetable of video lessons for each year group is available at the <u>Oak National Academy</u>, and <u>BBC Bitesize</u>.
