# Safeguarding

We believe that ensuring the safety and promoting the well-being of our children is the most important job we do as a school. We seek to intervene promptly when concerns arise and also to proactively teach our pupils the skills and knowledge they need to keep themselves safe. This belief and these practices are integral to our provision.

As parents and carers, you can help us in a number of ways:

- Ensure absence or lateness is reported promptly
- Notify the office if there is a change to address or emergency contact details
- Ensure we know the arrangements for pupil collection in advance
- Only seek entrance to the school through the main reception and sign in
- Ensure no hazardous objects or materials are brought to school
- Encourage healthy eating
- Ensure the school knows any medical conditions affecting your child and that any required medicines are provided and named
- Keep an open communication with the school if there are any matters affecting your child
- Be vigilant and report concerns to the school
- Carefully monitor your child's online activity and communication and promote safe internet use

## Uniform

Uniform is available to purchase through the school office. Our smart uniform reflects the high standard of personal conduct we promote with our pupils.

#### Compulsory P.E. items purchasable through the school office:

St Gabriel's crested white polo shirt. (£6.00)

St. Gabriel's crested grey sweatshirt. (£8.00)

#### **Compulsory P.E. items purchasable from a variety of retailers:**

Black shorts.

Trainers.

White socks.

Plain black jogging bottoms for winter months.

Pupils are required to change into their P.E. kit during the day.

#### The following additional items are available to purchase:

St Gabriel's crested reversible rain coat and fleece. (£23.50)

Children should not bring pencil cases to school as all stationery will be provided.

#### All school uniform and personal belongings must be named.

# **Our Curriculum**

The purpose of our curriculum at St Gabriel's is to equip our pupils with the tools they need to live fulfilled lives and prepare them well for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of later life; helping them flourish in our community. Through our curriculum we strive to captivate, excite and instil in our children a lifelong love of learning.

## English

Our English curriculum centres on engaging with quality texts and source material to create meaningful learning experiences. Every element of the English curriculum is linked under the theme of the text being studied to promote cohesion and motivation for our pupils.

## **Mathematics**

Our Maths curriculum places understanding, creativity, excitement and perseverance at the heart of the learning experience. We present teaching and learning which is rooted in a purpose – a context from real-life or topic linked – and use the scenario to develop mathematical fluency, reasoning and problem-solving.

#### Science

Our Science curriculum promotes deep curiosity about the world around us and seeks to develop both knowledge and skills which support children's development as scientists. Links with broader topics are explicitly made to help establish a network of understanding for our children.

## **Foundation Subjects**

Our foundation subjects - P.E., Art & Design, Design & Technology, Computing, Geography, History, Languages, Music, Personal Social and Health Education (PSHE) combine to deliver a rich, broad and balanced curriculum allowing our Vision – for our children to flourish in every way – to be realised.

# **Religious Education**

Our inclusive Christian ethos permeates the curriculum in the perspectives and values we share and through our times of collective worship and reflection. Special care is taken to ensure the beliefs of children from all faiths or no faith are valued, respected and shared as a community of learners.

# **Special Educational Needs**

Our philosophy is to provide the appropriate support and challenge at every level to ensure our pupils flourish and reach their potential. A key aspect of this is in our response to pupils with Special Educational needs or disabilities and the responsibility of all staff to collaborate in meeting need. All staff at St Gabriel's CofE Academy work in collaboration with the Special Educational Needs and Disabilities coordinator and our learning mentor as well as other agencies to support our children.

## Homework

At St Gabriel's, we believe that homework should deepen and consolidate children's learning and add to, not detract from, family time. Homework is set to support children's development and provide positive opportunities for families to spend time together. We utilise a range of online platforms to ensure homework is both engaging and supports children's understanding of their class-based learning.

## Wrap Around Care

Our before and after school care club (Angels) is provided by The Old Station Nursery and operates in the morning from 7:30am until 8:45am and in the afternoon from 3:15pm until 6pm. ## Parking

We appreciate how important it is for our families to be able to drop off and collect their children from school in a convenient, safe and timely way. If you are in a position to walk, ride or scoot to school, we would encourage you to do so. There are a limited number of parking spaces on the school site. We ask that drivers do not park on the verge and park with awareness of and respect for the safety of our children and the wider community. Please do not park in the disabled bays and do not drive or park on the pedestrianised area outside reception.

#### **Collection and Walking Home**

All children must be collected by a responsible individual who is aged 16 or over. In each child's registration information, it must be indicated who will generally be responsible for collecting each child.

Of course, as a school, we understand there are occasions where there needs to be a change of collection arrangements, where possible, communicate this to the school office before 1:30pm so the information can be passed on to class teachers.

If parents of children in Year 5 or Year 6 wish for them to walk or cycle home, this must be communicated in writing via registration information or letter to the school office otherwise children must be collected.

#### Lunches

Hot meals are available and are cooked on-site daily in our kitchen. Menu options are available in advance and include a main, vegetarian and jacket potato option with a salad bar.

Meals cost £2.35 but are free for all Reception and Key Stage 1 pupils (Universal

#### Infant Free School Meals UIFSM).

We would encourage as many pupils as possible to take up the offer of a hot, healthy and nutritious meal served daily.

#### No nuts or food containing nuts is to be brought into school.

## **Pupil Premium - Free School Meals**

Even if your child is entitled to UIFSM, you may still be eligible for Pupil Premium funding which provides the school with additional income to support your child as well as free school meals for children in KS2.
