

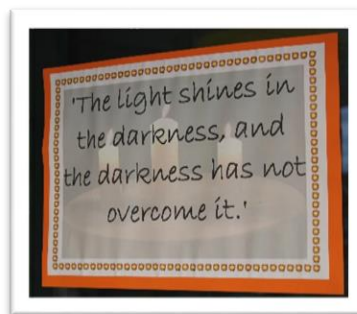
Dear parents and carers,

Tuesday 4th January - Teacher Training Day

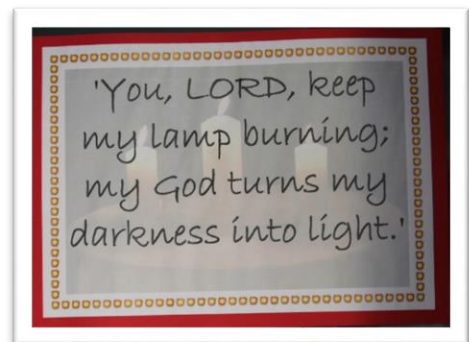
Wednesday 5th January - Spring Term starts.
