### Nursery



We have concentrated this week on using powerful adjectives to describe Goldilocks so that our wanted posters are more specific.

In Art, we created letters for our class and decorated them using different colours and these are now displayed outside of our classroom.



### Year 3 (Berners-Lee Class)

Berners-Lee have had a fantastic first week in Year 3 – I am so proud of how well they have settled into Key Stage 2. This week, we have learnt all about Sir Tim Berners-Lee and how he invented the World Wide Web. We had a lot of fun finding clues about him and then we connected up the clues using string to show how the World Wide Web connects different website pages. The pupils then created fact files about Berners-Lee and re-create the WWW logo. Super work this week year 3!




the portable fax machine, caller ID, caller waiting technologies and the touch tone telephone.


In Humanities, the students found out more about Johannes Gutenberg, his significance and impact on communication across the world.
